

Early Literacy Tip -- Talking:

When we engage in rhyming games with children, we help them focus on hearing specific sounds, which will help them learn to hear and identify separate syllables in words, an essential skill for learning to read.

Bonus Activity:

Read a wordless picture book with your child by talking about the pictures. How many different words can you use to describe what you see?
