Early Literacy Tip -- Writing:

Fine motor skills, like writing, grow from large motor skills. Providing opportunities for children to move their bodies helps develop those motor skills so they will be ready to learn to write when they start school.

Bonus Activity:

Recite or sing a nursery rhyme and add some actions. Be sure to ask a librarian for rhymes or songs if you need inspiration.
