

LIBRARY/COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

JMRL regularly collaborates with community organizations in order to enhance its mission of connecting people with ideas, information, and each other. These collaborations could take the form of program partnership, the exchange or promotion of community services, or sharing of resources.

Established ways to partner with the Library include:

- Displays of original art as described in JMRL Policy: Section 4.52
- Library outreach to organizations or community events either offsite or as JMRL branch visits; jmrl.org/outreach

A decision to partner will be guided by the Library's mission and values, and may be subject to approval by the Library Board of Trustees at the discretion of the Director. The Library may also seek to partner with other organizations or institutions in order to make use of outside skills, expertise or resources.

A Library partnership is generally limited in scope and does not constitute an endorsement by JMRL of the outside organization, nor does it establish a legal partnership or joint venture.
